KALAMANDALAM GOPI

Kathakali, the south Indian traditional dance-drama, is globally recognized as a profound cultural and aesthetic heritage. Ever since its evolution in the 17th century, scores of icons have developed the art form using their body-discipline and imaginative prowess. In the 20th century, a cream of artists catapulted Kathakali to a universal art cutting across geographical and linguistic boundaries. Among them is Kalamandalam Gopi, the top- ranking actor who has won universal fame by means of

his matchless artistry.

Poet laureate and cultural ambassador, Vallathol Narayana Menon who founded Kerala Kalamandalam in 1930 was instantly impressed by Gopi when he came before the Selection Committee for admission to the acting course of Kathakali. Gopi underwent rigorous training in Kathakali under Kalamandalam Ramankutty Nair and Kalamandalam Padmanabhan Nair, the two great Acharyas. On completion of his training, Gopi was appointed Instructor in the Faculty of Kathakali (1958).

Astute sense of rhythm, command over tempos, graceful figure, expressive facial features and a fierce commitment to the art collectively contributed to the meteoric rise of Gopi in Kathakali. His Raudra Bhima who confronts Dussasana in the Kurukshetra battle has few parallels in the history of Kathakali.

Gopi has travelled extensively in India and abroad for over five decades and has won critical acclaim from art lovers all over the world. The intensity with which he identifies with the characters, power and precision in the execution of hand gestures and kalasams (dance units) and pithy improvisations are enviable. Gopi is the last link of a glorious heritage in the kalluvazhi chitta of Kathakali which gave birth to a host of titans in the 20th century.

Gopi retired as Principal of Kerala Kalamandalam in 1992 after serving the institution for over three decades.

He has won acclaim from art-lovers all over the world. Gopi is equally well-versed on stage and in the kalari. He has an astounding skill for tuning the body and limbs of the Kathakali students in relation to the text, contexts and characterization.

DR. KANAK RELE

The renowned performer, educationist, research scholar and above all a Guru / Teacher par excellence Kanak Rele has today become a legend in her own lifetime. The President of India has honoured her as "A pioneering dance educationist".

Research Scholar and Institution Builder:

50 years ago, in 1966, Kanak Rele established Nalanda Dance Academy (later to be renamed

Nalanda Dance Research Centre), where Kanak has done pioneering work in nurturing pedagogical studies in dance and allied subjects. Today Nalanda Dance Research Centre is recognized officially as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation – SIRO -by the Ministry of Science and Technology. Govt. of India, the only dance institution to be thus recognised.

Unique Pioneering Research Contribution:

Rejuvenator of Mohini Attam: Widely acclaimed as one of the most distinguished Mohini Attam exponents, today her name is synonymous with the dance style. But her fame is not only limited to performance. This most lyrical of Indian classical dance styles was facing extinction 45 years ago. It is acknowledged that Kanak Rele has played pioneering and most significant role in re-establishment, rejuvenation and popularisation of Mohini Attam not only in India but abroad as well.

Dance Educationist: Today Kanak Rele has emerged as the most distinguished dance educationist in the country. She is universally recognized and respected as an outstanding guru / teacher / research guide. It was on Kanak's proposal that the University of Mumbai introduced the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Dance), Master of Fine Arts (Dance) and Ph.D. in Dance degrees. She is the architect of the Faculty of Fine Arts of the University of Mumbai and is the Founder-Principal of the renowned college of classical dance Nalanda Nritya Kala Mahavidyalaya established in 1972. Kanak was the chief architect of these courses. Over the years, Nalanda college has created an exceptionally well trained, highly qualified and scholarly generation of dancers who are not only proficient performers but also excellent theoreticians, analysers and teachers.

An Author: Kanak Rele has three excellent books to her credit which have won critical acclaim. The first editions are sold out and revised second editions are already released.

A Documentary Maker: One of Kanak's greatest achievements is the video film Nritya Bharati – on the seven classical dance styles of India and their shastric base. This has been acquired by the Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India as the official capsule to be kept by all the Indian Missions abroad.

Superb Choreographer: Kanak has choreographed some highly acclaimed dance – productions apart from the Mohini Attam repertoire. Each dance – drama is significant for its unique choreography which is based on deep research. Kanak also designs the costumes of her dance – dramas and also contributes in arranging the musical score.

Nalanda's Productions:

- Santa Vani' in Marathi based on the abhangas of the saint poets of Maharashtra. This dance-drama has been sent abroad by the Govt. of India. It has completed more than 100 performances.
- Shilappadikaram' in Hindi translating the immortal ancient Tamil epic of the same name into a poem in dance.
- Kalyani' in Hindi based on the immortal lyrics Chandalika of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore.
- Svapnavasavadattam the immortal ancient Sanskrit drama by Bhasa.
 The production is cast in the classical "Total Theatre" mode of Sanskrit "natya".
- Kanchan Mrig in Hindi dealing with wildlife preservation and "ahimsa" (non-violence) towards all beings.
- Rukmini Svayamvara in Marathi using the 600 years old Bharud lyrics by Saint Eknath of Maharashtra.

SHRI. RUDRAPRASAD SENGUPTA

Rudraprasad Sengupta is a veteran in the field of theatre and drama. Hailing from Kolkata, he today enjoys nationwide emminence not only as an actor but also as an adaptor of plays.


His college education which earned him Bachelor's and Master's degrees in English literature, has given him an enviable vision into the nuances of this universal language. He taught English at the Rabindra Bharati

University of Kolkata.

His association with the renowned theatre group Nandikar since 1961 has resulted in the dual role of actor and adaptor of plays. His adaptation of Pirandello's 'Six Characters in search of an Author' (Natyakarer Sandhane Chhati Charitra) catapulted him to instant fame. His adaptation of the works of like Euripides, Brecht, Arthur Miller and Arnold Wesker established him as the most consistent as well as prominent director in Bengali thetre. He gradually blossomed into a very fine actor. His forte appears to be presentation of anti-Heroic or malevolent characters.

Rudraprasad's independent and distinctive directorial style came to the fore from 1977 when he assumed the leadership of Nandikar. A dedicated advocate of theatre as a career he formed the Calcutta Repertory Theatre with Sombhu Mitra and other major actors of Kalkata in 1980. In 1983, Sengupta started the Nandikar Theatre Festival where theatre troupes from all over India participate. Under Rudraprasad's directorship Nandikar conducts workshops for school children as well slum-dwelling children in theatre craft. He has written a book 'Ibsen Theke Albee' (From Ibsen to Albee).

Rudraprasad received the prestigious Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 1980.



DR UMAYALPURAM K SIVARAMAN

Dr Umayalpuram K Sivaraman born on 17thDec 1935, has by dint of superlative artistry on the art of mrudangam, earned himself a unique place as one of the greatest legends. In a career spanning 70 years till date, he has covered the entire gamut of percussive music, accompanying the greatest legends in Carnatic music & Hindustani music, playing with the best of Jazz bands and Fusion music, exclusive percussion concerts with a variety of

instruments, lecture demonstrations, research on the science of design & construction of mrudangam. He has documented his unique 'bani' through his book "The voyage of mrudangam and itshigh voltage art@" covering all facets of mrudangam playing techniques and nuances. He has been honoured with many prestigious awards including the Padma Vibhushon awarded by the President of India, and nuances unique place.

He has established unique bani (style) of his own, "the Umayalpuram Sivaraman bani" and trained hundreds of students in Indio and abroad and has bequeathed his knowledge of this great art form, techniques, nuances to these disciples to continue this tradition globally. He has pioneered the comprehensive documentation of this through his magnum opus; a 22 and ½ hour, 7 pack DVD "Mrudanga Chintamanih". These DVD sets include excerpts from his book, "The Voyage of Mrudangam and Its High Voltage Art@". As a sequel to this, another 2 pack DVD "MorasondKarvais" that runs for 10 hours and contains 200+ compositions has been released. A significant highlight is the demonstration of his own compositions for dance (Adavus) and the pinnacle of glory for any percussionist.
