By honouring them, Nalanda is honouring India on behalf of all Indians.



C. V. Chandrasekhar, one of India's senior most Bharatanatyam dancers was trained by Smt. Rukmani Devi Arundale. He has imbibed from his mentor the best of Indian art, culture and aesthetics. He served the universities of Banaras and Baroda and retired as the Head and Dean of the Faculty of Performing Arts of M. S. University of Baroda. He along with his dancer wife, Smt. Jaya Chandrasekhar have settled in Chennai and together, they have established

Nrithyashree, an institution which involves teaching, choreographing and performing. Chandrasekhar is a multi-faceted personality being a dancer, choreographer, researcher, musician, academician, composer and highly acclaimed teacher of Bharatanatyam. He has been performing for the past five decades in India and all over the globe and is invited by many dancers the world over to teach and choreograph. Chandrasekhar has a number of music and dance compositions to his credit and his dance dramas have been very highly acclaimed for their individuality and innovative approach. His choreographic works include Kalidasa's Ritu Samharam and Meghadootham, Aparajitha, Pancha Maha Bhootham, Arohanam, Bhoomija, Bhramarageeth and many others. His visits abroad include countries of Europe, the U.S.A. and Asian countries China, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Philippines, Indonesia, Cambodia, Laos, Kuwait, Mauritius, Reunion etc.

Pandit Ram Narayan

Pandit Ram Narayan's name is synonymous with that of the Sarangi. His command over the technique of playing the Sarangi reached a point when he felt his role as an accompanist was too restrictive as he had far too much to offer in music than his role allowed. He then launched a solitary one man effort to enhance the status of the Sarangi on the concert platform. As any pioneering enterprise, the initial response is always disheartening. His unrelenting dedication and perseverance however, kept his effort alive. The technical innovations he instituted have revolutionized

its playing introducing a style that is now universally accepted as a model standard for all Sarangi players.

Besides his phenomenal technical ability, Ram Narayan's success is also based on richness of his musical ideas. By principle a purist, he has combined a powerful technical ability with a traditional approach to the actual music content, to produce a music, a sound that is at once appealing to any intellect.

The great musician Yehudi Menuhin comments:

"The Sarangi remains not only the authentic and original Indian Bowed instrument but the one which most poignantly and in the hands of Ram Narayan most revealingly expresses the very soul of Indian feelings and thought. I cannot separate the Sarangi from Ram Narayan so thoroughly fused are they not only in my memory but in the fact of this sublime dedication of the great musician to an instrument which is no longer archaic because of the matchless way he has made it speak".

In addition to perfecting the art of performing, Ram Narayana has also nurtured musical talent amongst his students.

Shri. Ratnakar Matkari is a multi-faced theatre personality of Maharashtra. A renowned play writer, director and producer of highly acclaimed and successful plays. He has written 65 plays in Marathi. He is the author of 3 novels, a large number of essays and short stories.

Ratnakar Matkari has a deep interest in children's activities. He has written a large number of plays, stories, songs for children.

- 3) Conducting research projects that enhance the understanding, appreciation and knowledge about dance not only as a cultural phenomenon but also as an adjunct to human development.

Rejuvenation of Mohini Attam at Nalanda:

This is a unique and very important Department of Nalanda. The dance style was almost forgotten at the turn of the present century. Dr. Kanak Rele and Nalanda have played a very significant role in not only rehabilitating this dance style but, more importantly, in creating technically sound courses of study for beginners as well at the University level.
