The formulation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from BPA I - MPA II (dance) is a layered progression made by the University of Mumbai. To develop and deploy the action plan, the institution has evolved methodology to enhance their teaching methods which will be effectively suited for the present generation. The prescribed courses are of 3 categories - Core, Foundation and Electives. Core courses are an integral part and

We also visit municipality schools, to teach dance as an activity to reach the unreached. Infrastructure and Learning Resources The present building admeasuring approximately 1,700 sq. mtrs. Carpet area stands on a plot of land (admeasuring 15000 sq. ft.). The building houses classrooms, library, gymnasium, an Indian style baithak auditorium with a stage, professional and a well-equipped recording cum editing studio. There are 9 rooms which are used as classrooms for teaching practicals and theory. There are spacious and well-ventilated classrooms. The classrooms do not have benches and desks which are permanently placed. The students sit on the floor and use portable wooden study tables for the theory classes. Nalanda has a well-equipped state of the art recording cum editing studio admeasuring approx. 600 sq. ft. Learning aids and illustrated course material in the form of CDs have been prepared in the studio. The Rajata Sabha is the Smart classroom which is air-conditioned and has an LED T.V.,

LED monitor, Screen, Laptop, LED Lights, Wi-Fi, Internet with LAN and a White Board.

There is fully equipped Health, Fitness and Nutrition Studio called as "Svasti" on the ground floor. Yoga lessons are imparted to the students at Yogadham (1st Floor). The Kanaka Sabha on the 1st floor is used for all cultural activities. The RG Saraiya Library of Nalanda is well-equipped with Books, Journals, Magazines, Theses and Dissertations, Newspaper, Map, Multimedia and Archival Collections. The Library has an extension of Internet-Access Room and Studio. Library is partially automated with SOUL 2.0 software for its in-house-activities and have subscribed N-list Consortia for E-Resource Access since 2018. Recently Library has also subscribed URKUND-ANTI-PLAGIARISM software to check plagiarism in PHD Theses, Dissertations, Projects and Research Articles. The IT facilities of the institution aim to serve both the aspects of Dance Education - Practicals and Theory. These facilities are provided to the students, teaching faculty, library and administrative staff. Every year, the institution has been adding to its IT Infrastructure. There are established systems to use the Library, Auditorium, Studio, Smart classroom, Costumes and Property. The

The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Response:

Nalanda Dance Research Centre was established in 1966 by the renowned exponent Padmabhushan Dr.(Smt) Kanak Rele. It blossomed in 1973 as

Nalanda Nritya Kala Mahavidyalaya, a college of Indian Classical Dance, affiliated to the University

of Mumbai.

The

curriculum was designed in an Annual Examination pattern until 2016. From the academic year 2016, the Choice Based Credit System was introduced, after which

the prescribed course has been categorized into Core, Foundation and Electives. The Choice Based Credit System provides choice for students to select from the electives. Core courses

is mandatory and

must be studied to complete the requirement of a programme in a said discipline study. Foundation course is based on the core content that leads to

the theoretical

knowledge enhancement. Elective courses are soft skill courses that enable an exposure to some allied discipline

within the course. All matters related to the curriculum are designed and discussed by the Principal and faculties at the college and passed by the Board of Studies in dance. They are then passed in the Academic council and accepted by the University of Mumbai. To meet the criteria of Course outcome & measure the academic performance of students, faculty members conduct internal assignments, projects and presentations throughout the year. The achievement of Programme outcome & Programme specific outcome is reviewed through feedback from students, parents, teachers and alumni. Meeting with subject experts are arranged programme wise every semester,

for corrective actions to be taken, to bridge identified curriculum gaps

which helps in the curricular enhancement. Also special efforts are taken to

go beyond the syllabus for overall personality development of the learners.

To identify slow learners, medical certificates of the candidates are provided by the parents and special care is taken in teaching

them.

Co-curricular & Extracurricular activities are integral part of these courses. Students are motivated to participate in youth festival of the University of Mumbai and other inter-college competitions as per their interests and

abilities.

Students seeking admissions in Foundation 1 are taken based on their eligibility criteria given by University of Mumbai. For admissions in B.P.A - I, if a student passes an Entrance Exam (Practicals) conducted by the faculty, then he/she can skip Foundation I and

II. For admission in (Masters)

M.P.A, a statutory University Bachelor's Degree in Dance with sufficient training

in selected classical dance style

is required. In addition to this, a written and practical test is conducted

by the Principal and the faculties. The workload of the teachers



is distributed as per the University Grants Commission Department of Higher Education norms.

Accordingly it is ensured that the syllabus is completed on time where semester wise teaching plan of the teachers,

their individual workload and timetable is also recorded and analysed.

Attendance of the teachers is recorded by the biometric system and the report of which is

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At the beginning of every academic session, the Principal convenes a meeting with the teachers to discuss the teaching plan and the academic calendar.

The

teachers prepare the teaching plan semester wise. This helps the teachers to know the exact time to finish the syllabus and prepare their teaching strategies. The

prescribed course formulated in the Choice Based Credit System pattern has three categories namely Core, Foundation and Elective. This gives equal importance to external and internal marks for each subject whether practical or theoretical. The marks allotted to each has the evaluation of external i.e 60 percent and internal i. e 40 percent. The ratio of 60:40 gives the picture of the importance of internal evaluation with the external evaluation in the programme. Dance, being the performing art, both practical and theory are given equal importance and there is a one to one relationship between the teacher and the student. As regarding the theoretical aspect of the evaluation 1) Internal Assessment tests are conducted throughout the year in all subjects every semester and the marks are allotted to them in the semester examination as the internal marks. 2) Interactive classroom teaching is given great importance where, learning is encouraged to widen their thoughts and have a broad vision in their outlook. They are evaluated as per their involvement in group discussions, presentation, pictorial presentation, debates and competitions 3) Assignment projects are also given and the marks are evaluated. With regards to the reference material, students are encouraged to use library, the archivals or recordings



available and other relevant sources which motivates them to give their best. 4) With regards to the practical aspect, their performances in the class is monitored as per the minute correction given to them a in both the nritta (pure footwork) and abhinaya (facial expression). Every art form be it a plastic art or a performing art is a reflection of a culture it belongs to. Indian classical dance portrays the ethics and moral values of its underlying culture. Nalanda Nritya Kala Mahavidyalaya is an institution dedicated to the preservation and perpetuation of the Indian Dance (Classical and Folk) in the most traditional and pristine manner. The programmes designed in the curriculum focusses on the traditional cultural values, which integrates professional ethics, gender, human values and environmental sustainability in the curriculum. In the Foundation Classes subjects like History, Concept of Culture and Civilisation, Sanskrit, Epics and Technique of Dance are studied. This gives scope to the richness of Indian literature and Mythology. Irrespective of their gender the students are taught the nuances of the Indian Classical dance styles. In the First year subjects like Rituals and its relation to Arts introduces the ritualistic practices and its relevance to dance. While explaining the importance of the ritualistic tradition, the students also learns the intimate relationship between man and nature. The sacrifices which used to be performed were like "Thanks Giving" ceremony to the natural resources, such as Sun, Moon, Fire, Air and Rains. Dance itself has many metaphors to nature taking us closer to olden times or rural life. Subjects like Natyashastra, Religion and Philosophy along with Aesthetics, centres around the idea of a religion in the socio cultural frame work. The six systems of philosophy, known as Shad darshanas inculcate the human values and ethics amongst the students. Also, the subject Environmental science provides solution for sustainable practices in nature. In the Final degree year subjects like Interrelationship of Arts, enfolds the ancient canvas of the cultural heritage of our country. While studying the interlude of the plastic arts such as sculpture, painting and iconography with the performing arts (Dance), students witness the harmonious blending of the diverse forms of arts. Subjects like cultural history, its development and comparative study of dance provides a glimpse to delve further into the vastness of Indian Classical Dance. At the Post Graduate syllabus subjects like Asian Dramaturgy, Indian Poetics, Poetic Tradition and Western Dance etc. bring forth the artistic expressions at a global level. The

present building admeasuring approximately 1,700 sq. mtrs. carpet area, stands on a plot of land admeasuring 15000 sq. ft. Classrooms and Tutorial Spaces:- There are spacious and well-ventilated classrooms. Since it is traditional classical dancing that is being taught at Nalanda, footwear is not used within the college premises. The classrooms do not have benches and desks which are permanently placed. The students sit on the floor and use portable wooden study tables for the theory classes. The classrooms are utilized for both teaching of practicals as well as theory. There are 9 rooms which are used as classrooms for teaching practicals and theory. Gandharva Sabha (located on the ground floor), Kanaka Sabha and Rajata Sabha (located on the 1st floor), Ratna Sabha and Tamra Sabha (located on the 2nd floor), Chitra Sabha and Chitta Sabha (located on the 3rd floor), Chidakasha A and Chidakasha B (located on the 4th floor). Kanaka Sabha:- The Indian style auditorium of Nalanda - "Kanaka Sabha" measuring approx. 2,200 sq. ft. is fully air- conditioned and has a seating arrangement in Baithak style. There is a separate technician's room for sound management on stage. The Kanaka Sabha is the perfect place for conducting workshops on dance and other choreographic experiments. Every Wednesdays the Kanaka Sabha is also used as 'Yogadham'. Four days a week the Kanaka Sabha is used every mornings for functional training exercises. The Kanaka Sabha is also used for celebrations like Guru Purnima, Dassera and other extra-curricular activities like workshops on orientation to the participants of Youth Festival, etc. Gandharva Sabha:- is used for teaching music and tala to the students. The Ratna Sabha, Tamra Sabha, Chitra Sabha and Chitta Sabha are used for both theory and practical lectures. Except the Chitta Sabha, all the 3 rooms also have white boards. Response:

Nalanda believes in the multi racial, multi lingual, multi ethnic culture of our country. Nalanda welcomes students not only across the country but from all corners of the world. Students come from various states of India such as, Kerala, Tamilnadu, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Gujrat, Goa etc. and also from foreign countries like Mauritius, Singapore, Japan, Sri Lanka etc. The regional differences such as linguistic barriers, food habits, dressing style do occur, but they are overcome by the special efforts put in by the faculty members and the Principal. In fact it has always been a challenging task for the teachers to make students aware of our cultural heritage, especially students who come from foreign countries to learn the classical Indian dance. The core subject classical dance demands studies of our ancient scriptures in Sanskrit. Although it is a difficult task for them, but our faculties arrange for the extra lectures for such students. Sanskrit Din is celebrated in the college every year. The college has a Lipi Literary Association where in the students who are good in writing and reading English language and also good in academics, help the students who belong to the vernacular medium and the students who are poor in studies. Saksham a movement run by the students wherein the students good in the practical aspect of the curriculum (Dance) help to improve the students who are weak at grasping the subject. The most significant contribution made by Nalanda is that the art of Classical Dance, which was exclusively practiced by the women made accessible for the men. Over the years number of men have made their career in classical dance, some of them like Shri Deepak Muzumdar, Shri Vaibhav Arekar, Shri Shrikant Iyer etc. have achieved great acclaim in the field of art at National and International level. Since the art of classical dance was groomed in the temple, it has a spiritual background. Hindu mythology played an important role in grooming the art of classical dance. In spite of this fact students who hailed from the other religions were encouraged by Nalanda. Subjects such as Culture, Epics, Religion, and Philosophy etc. widened the horizons of religious understanding of the students. Nalanda has a disciplined schedule of the day, considering the various needs of the students coming from the varied background. The day begins with the prayers in Sanskrit and national anthem. Herself trained in the majestic dance style like Kathakali from her childhood under the able guidance of a renowned traditional Guru, Dr.Smt. Rele was very well aware of the importance of the traditional systematic training in the field of classical art forms. Considering the above fact, Dr. Rele strived to raise an institution dedicated to provide training in the most traditional format. With the cooperation extended by the University of Mumbai she designed a curriculum, in the subject of classical dance. Nalanda made the knowledge of classical dance available to the students belonging to every strata of the society in its chaste, traditional form, which was a monopoly of the handful of students, who belonged to the wealthy families. Very generous and a genuine concern towards the spread of the nation's cultural heritage to the upcoming generations of the artists is the unique and distinctive thrust of Nalanda. In order to pursue its goal the college has introduced various Undergraduate, Post graduate, Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma courses in dance styles such as Bharata Natyam, Kathakali, Mohini Attam, Kathak and Odissi. Other than these classical dance forms Nalanda also has a Diploma Course in Folk Dance. The training in the above mentioned styles is imparted by the qualified teachers in the most systematic format. Since 2016 Nalanda has opted for Choice Based Credit System, which allows students to learn various allied subjects as Electives. The syllabus for these subjects aim at complementing the core subject. The Elective subjects include Make Up, Food and Nutrition, Various regional languages such as Tamil, Malayalam etc.. Also the students can opt for a dance style other than their own, which enables students to learn variety of dance forms. The everyday regime at the college includes morning prayers in Sanskrit, paying obeisance to Lord Shiva the Nataraja, then to Gurus concluding with National Anthem. This session introduces students to our cultural values and patriotic spirit. After the prayer session students join the regular Work out as well as Yoga sessions, which enable them to remain physically and mentally fit. These sessions are conducted by the qualified faculties. The college also has a gym in the premises. After the work out session students relax for a while and then disperse for the morning breakfast, as students travel from far off places to Nalanda. After the morning fitness regime the regular practical and theory classes begin. On Dassera the Jewellery, Costumes and all the Instruments are worshipped. Students offer bells (ghungroo) at the feet of the guru and then perform a dance piece. Nalanda also celebrates events like Sanskrit Day on Kalidasa Jayanti, the nature club "Vasundhara" every year celebrates tree plantation in the month of July. Every year Nalanda students perform for an NGO called "Ameya Palak Sanghatana", on their foundation day to cheer up mentally challenged students.
